



# THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS



## **Entrance Antiphon**

Cf. Gal 6: 14

We should glory in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, in whom is our salvation, life and resurrection, through whom we are saved and delivered.

### Collect

## First reading

Numbers 21:4b-9

'If anyone were bitten by a serpent, he would look at the bronze serpent and live.'

A reading from the Book of Numbers

In those days: The people became impatient on the way. And the people spoke against God and against Moses, 'Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we loathe this worthless food.' Then the Lord sent fiery serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many people of Israel died.

And the people came to Moses and said, 'We have sinned, for we have spoken against the Lord and against you. Pray to the Lord, that he take away the serpents from us.'

So Moses prayed for the people. And the Lord said to Moses, 'Make a fiery serpent and set it on a pole, and everyone who is bitten, when he sees it, shall live.' So Moses made a bronze serpent and set it on a pole. And if a serpent bit anyone, he would look at the bronze serpent and live.

## Responsorial Psalm p 219 Ps 78(77):1-2. 34-35. 36-37. 38. **R** cf. 7b

## Never forget the deeds of the Lord!

Give ear, my people, <u>to</u> my teaching; incline your ear to the words <u>of</u> my mouth. I will open my mouth <u>in</u> a parable and utter hidden lessons of the past. **R** 

When he slew them, <u>then</u> they sought him, repented and earnest-<u>ly</u> sought God. They would remember

that God <u>was</u> their rock,
God the Most High <u>their</u> re-deemer. **R** 

Yet they deceived him <u>with</u> their mouths; they lied to him <u>with</u> their tongues. For their hearts were not stead-<u>fast</u> towards him;

Yet he who is full <u>of</u> com-passion forgave them their <u>sin</u> and spared them. So often he held <u>back</u> his anger, and did not stir up <u>all</u> his rage.

Philippians 2:6-11

'He humbled himself, therefore God has highly exalted him.'

A reading from the Letter of St Paul to the Philippians

Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
