KNEEL Invitation to Communion

Showing the Body of the Lord to the people, the Priest invites all those duly prepared, and allowed, to come forward for Holy Communion saying:

Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb

Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed. As the Priest reverently consumes the Body and Blood of Christ the Lector says the Communion Antiphon Cf. Ps 32: 18-19

Behold, the eyes of the Lord are on those who fear him, who hope in his merciful love, to rescue their souls from death, to keep them alive in famine.

Mk 10: 45

The Son of Man has come to give his life as a ransom for many.

The communicants then come forward in reverent procession and make an act of reverence in honour of Christ's presence in the Sacrament. They receive Holy Communion standing. If you are a Communicant member of the Church of England or in your own Church you may receive the Sacrament, if not, please hold this "Order for Mass" and you will receive a Blessing.

You should only receive Communion if you were in Church before the Gospel was read.

You may Receive in One Kind (The Body of Christ) or in Both Kinds (The Body and Blood of Christ). Communion by Intinction (dipping the Host into the Chalice) is not permitted.
