THE INTRODUCTORY RITES

STAND at the sound of the Sacristy bell,
music is played as the Choir and Ministers
enter. As the Altar and Cross are Censed,
we sing sing (439):

The Blessing of the Epiphany Crib

The Ministers stand before the Crib.

From the East came the Magi to Bethlehem to
adore the Lord; and opening their treasures
they offered precious gifts: gold for the great
King, incense for the true God, and myrrh in
symbol of His burial.

*The Magi figures are brought forward to be placed in
the Crib with prayers.*

At the presentation of the figure (gold)

that we may be a royal priesthood acceptable in

our prayer rises up before you as incense, so
may we be presented before you with penitent
hearts and uplifted hands to offer ourselves in
your priestly service.

At the presentation of the figure (myrrh)

Blessed are you, Lord our God, King of the
universe to you be praise and glory for ever. As
you give medicine to heal our sickness And the
leaves of the trees of life for the healing of the
nations, so anoint us with your healing power

that we may be the first-fruits of your new creation.

They told him, 'In Bethlehem of Judea, for so it is written by the prophet: "And you, O Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel." ' Then Herod summoned the wise men secretly and ascertained from them what time the star had appeared. After listening to the king, they went on their way. And behold, the star that they had seen when it rose went before them until it came to rest over the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy. And going into the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshipped him. Then, opening their

treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh. And being warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed to their own country by another way.

forward for Holy Communion saying:*

*As the Priest reverently consumes the Body and
Blood of Christ the Lector says the **Communion
Antiphon - Cf. Mt 2: 2** We have seen his star in
the East, and have come with gifts to adore the
Lord.*



*The communicants then come forward in
reverent procession and make an act of
reverence in honour of Christ's presence
in the Sacrament. They receive Holy Communion
standing. If you are a Communicant member of the
Church of England or in your own Church you may
receive the Sacrament, if not, please hold this "Order
for Mass" and you will receive a Blessing.*

**You should only receive Communion if you
were in Church before the Gospel was read**

*You may Receive in One Kind (The Body of
Christ) or in Both Kinds (The Body and Blood
of Christ). **Communion by Intinction**
(dipping the Host into the Chalice) **is not
permitted.***

*While we receive Communion the Choir sings the
Communion Meditation (619)*

*After the distribution of Communion we all sing
(64)*
