When Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew into Galilee. As the Priest reverently consumes the Body and Blood of Christ the Lector says the **Communion Antiphon Jn 8: 12**

*I am the light of the world, says the Lord;
whoever follows me will not walk in darkness,
but will have the light of life.*



The communicants then come forward in reverent procession and make an act of reverence in honour of Christ's presence in the Sacrament. They receive Holy Communion standing. If you are a Communicant member of the Church of England or in your own Church you may receive the Sacrament, if not, please hold this "Order for Mass" and you will receive a Blessing.

You should only receive Communion if you were in Church before the Gospel was read.

*You may Receive in One Kind (The Body of Christ) or in Both Kinds (The Body and Blood of Christ). **Communion by Intinction (dipping the Host into the Chalice) is not permitted.***
