

A new bishop for Christ's Church

A novena of prayer as we prepare for the consecration of Fr Luke Irvine-Capel SSC as the fourth Bishop of Richborough

Wednesday 19th February to Thursday 27th February



An introduction to this novena of prayer

At a service starting at 2.30pm on Thursday 27th February 2025, Fr Luke Irvine-Capel SSC will be consecrated as the fourth Bishop of Richborough in Canterbury Cathedral. Fr Luke will need our prayers as he prepares for his consecration and his new ministry as a bishop. This novena of prayer in the days leading up to the service will surround him with our love and prayers.

The word 'novena' comes from the Latin for nine and is an ancient practice of prayer in the Church. The tradition of having a novena started with that period of prayer between the Ascension of Jesus and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, when the disciples were gathered in prayer. The content of this novena is based on the ordination service for a bishop and focuses on the elements of ministry which are particular to bishops. It runs from Wednesday 19th to Thursday 27th February 2025.

Within the fellowship of all the baptised, bishops play a distinctive and important role within the Church. Bishops lead priests and people in following the rules of the Church and in worshipping God well. They help the Church to navigate through many difficulties in our modern world and to fight against the attacks of the devil on the unity of the Church. Bishops need our prayers to support them in their many duties. Please do pray for Fr Luke's wife, Ruth, and for other members of his family. Pray too for the priests, people and parishes of the See of Richborough amongst whom Fr Luke will serve and minster. Indeed, I ask that you also pray for all my brother Society bishops. As you spend time in prayer, I hope that you will also have a greater understanding of the role of the bishop, and the part that you can play in supporting and upholding bishops in their office and in their ministry. May God's blessing be on Fr Luke and on the See of Richborough at this important moment in the life of The Society.

Day 1 - Wednesday 19th February The Bishop as Shepherd

▼ In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Bishops are called to serve and care for the flock of Christ. Mindful of the Good Shepherd, who laid down his life for his sheep, they are to love and pray for those committed to their charge, knowing their people and being known by them. (From the Ordination Service for a Bishop – Common Worship)

Today we pray for Fr Luke as he prepares to take on the role of shepherd. May his heart be daily enlarged, through prayer, with love for God, and the people committed to his care.

Day 2 - Thursday 20th February The Bishop as Minister of Word and Sacrament

As principal ministers of word and sacrament, stewards of the mysteries of God, they are to preside at the Lord's table and to lead the offering of prayer and praise. They are to feed God's pilgrim people, and so build up the Body of Christ. (From the Ordination Service for a Bishop – Common Worship)

We pray today for Fr Luke as he prepares to enter into a new relationship with the sacramental ministry of the Church. Praying that the celebration of the Mass will continue to sustain and strengthen his ministry. Praying for him as he prepares, as a Bishop, to administer the sacraments of Confirmation and Ordination. We pray to for his priests who share in his sacramental ministry.

They are to baptize and confirm, nurturing God's people in the life of the Spirit and leading them in the way of holiness. (From the Ordination Service for a Bishop – Common Worship)

We pray today for all people across the See of Richborough who will benefit from Fr Luke's ministry as a Bishop. Praying that the Holy Spirit will guide, nurture and sustain him in a life of holiness; and that this life of prayer and dedication to Jesus will strengthen him as he nurtures and leads us on the path of holiness.

Day 4, Saturday 22nd February The Bishop who ordains Priests and Deacons

⚠ In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

They are to discern and foster the gifts of the Spirit in all who follow Christ, commissioning them to minister in his name. They are to preside over the ordination of deacons and priests, and join together in the ordination of bishops. (From the Ordination Service for a Bishop – Common Worship)

The Bishop shares his oversight and ministry with his Priests. We pray today that Fr Luke's example as a Bishop will inspire men to consider whether God is calling them to the Priesthood. That he will foster vocations with enthusiasm and gentleness, that more Priests may bless God's Church with their ministry. We pray for those preparing for ordination, who will receive this sacrament at the hands of the Bishop of Richborough.

As chief pastors, it is their duty to share with their fellow presbyters the oversight of the Church, speaking in the name of God and expounding the gospel of salvation. (From the Ordination Service for a Bishop – Common Worship)

We pray today that as Bishop of Richborough, Fr Luke will be given the courage and words to speak out in God's name, may the Holy Spirit guide his preaching and teaching. We pray that he will be sustained and supported in his ministry by his Priests and Deacons, with whom he shares his ministry.

Day 6 - Monday 24th February The Bishop's role in discipline

▼ In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

With the Shepherd's love, they are to be merciful, but with firmness; to minister discipline, but with compassion. (From the Ordination Service for a Bishop – Common Worship)

The Bishop's role is not always an easy one. At times they have to say difficult things, both to the Church and wider society. We pray that Fr Luke will be sustained by the Holy Spirit in these times, that he may approach this task through the courage and love of the Good Shepherd.

Day 7 - Tuesday 25th February The Bishop for those in need

▼ In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

They are to have a special care for the poor, the outcast and those who are in need. They are to seek out those who are lost and lead them home with rejoicing, declaring the absolution and forgiveness of sins to those who turn to Christ. (From the Ordination Service for a Bishop – Common Worship)

In all of our parishes, we do not have to look far to see people in poverty, isolation or need. We see the need of people for the love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ. May Fr Luke model his ministry on Jesus, the Good Shepherd; that he may seek out the lost, and care for the poor and needy.

⚠ In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Following the example of the prophets and the teaching of the apostles, they are to proclaim the gospel boldly, confront injustice and work for righteousness and peace in all the world. (From the Ordination Service for a Bishop – Common Worship)

The role of the Bishop as a teacher is an important one. We pray for Fr Luke that he will preach the Gospel boldly and teach the Catholic faith with passion and clarity. We pray that his example will lead the whole See of Richborough to confront the unjust structures in society and that we may be known for our work to build up peace and justice.

Day 9 - Thursday 27th February - The day of Fr Luke's consecration The Bishop as Guardian of the Faith

▼ In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Bishops are ordained to be shepherds of Christ's flock and guardians of the faith of the apostles, proclaiming the gospel of God's kingdom and leading his people in mission. Obedient to the call of Christ and in the power of the Holy Spirit, they are to gather God's people and celebrate with them the sacraments of the new covenant. Thus formed into a single communion of faith and love, the Church in each place and time is united with the Church in every place and time. (From the Ordination Service for a Bishop – Common Worship)

We rejoice today at the consecration of Fr Luke as Bishop of Richborough. We pray for his wife Ruth and all his family. Today is a day of great change in Fr Luke's life and ministry; at the ordination service, these words will be spoken to Fr Luke as he prepares to have hands laid on him – and they form part of our prayer for him today and throughout his Episcopal ministry: You cannot bear the weight of this calling in your own strength, but only by the grace and power of God. Pray therefore that you may be conformed more and more to the image of God's Son, so that through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit your life and ministry may be made holy and acceptable to God.
